Another boring day in grape growing paradise otherwise known as the Edna Valley.

Thanks to it's close proximity to the Pacific Ocean (four miles as the seagull flies), and its location on California's central coast, the Edna Valley is blessed with the perfect environment for grapes.

The reason the Niven family, Baileyana's founders, were attracted to this unique area. The cool ocean water off the coast triggers a natural fog machine which moves in and out of the valley daily blanketing Baileyana's estate vineyards. Overall, the winters are milder and the summers are cooler than our wine-growing neighbors to the north. In fact, the Edna Valley has one of the longest growing seasons in the state extending until late October to early November.



The Edna Valley was once the ocean floor. Marine deposits along with volcanic remnants gives this growing area one of the most unique soil structures in the world.



The result of the Edna Valley's consistent climate is the perfection of ideal ripeness. That is, when the correct chemistry of the grape is in balance with the winemaker's ideal flavor components.



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
