

At the Firepeak Vineyard, they say it's the dirt of the devil that makes our wine so heavenly. Firepeak Vineyard is a low-yielding parcel located at the base of Islay Mountain in the Edna Valley where the soil is a combination of clay loam, rocky sediment and volcanic remnants. This "dirt of the devil", as its known in geological circles, stresses the vines encouraging the intense varietal characteristics found in every Firepeak Vineyard wine. The Niven Family, viticulture pioneers of the Edna Valley, used their 30 years of grape growing experience and experimentation to decide on rootstock, vine spacing, trellising and clonal selections to take advantage of the unique terroir of the Firepeak Vineyard and the Edna Valley.



Adjacent to Baileyana's estate winery, Firepeak Vineyard sits at the foot of the last in a chain of extinct volcanic cones called the Seven Sisters.
